Pink Training

We hosted the largest LGBT+ conference held in Europe the last weekend in November. Over 300 students attended the event across the country.

Mental Health Mondays

Carried out and finished the 9 week campaign. A decision was made to carry the campaign forward in Semester 2 to encourage more student engagement across campus. Last semester's campaign consisted of a collaborative online awareness campaign with GMIT Students' Union and Please Talk addressing different areas around mental health. A physical presence was ensured on campus every week in the Concourse and the Engineering building. This semester we are hoping to have clearer messaging and more of an engaging campaign including short lecture addresses etc (moving away from the online style we had previously). I'm always open to new suggestions, you can get involved at any stage!

Exam Destress

The Education Officer and myself ran an exam destress campaign in the lead up to exams. We distributed free fruit and water bottles and had a room booked out for students to relax in.

Sexual Harassment Working Group

Currently working on an improved sexual harassment policy with university management.

UL Students Against Direct Provision - National Campaign

Attended a meeting to plan a national campaign on ending the Direct Provision system. The next meeting will be convened in the next 4 weeks.

Clothes Bank

Introduced the clothes bank initiative before the Christmas break. Students were able to make donations of items of clothing. These clothes were then made available for any students to students. Any surplus items at the end were donated to charity. It was successful and I'm hoping to continue it on in semester 2 with a possibility of becoming an annual practice in the Union.

Food Bank

Met with Gareth who is the CEO of SUCS (Students' Union Commercial Services). He was very much in favour of introducing a food bank initiative whereby any surplus food from our commercial services are given to students who may be struggling financially. It's still in working progress as guidelines etc have to be written up.
