Irish Deaf Society (Lack of funding)

We know that the IDS is the principal advocacy organization for the deaf in Ireland and that they are running out of state funding.

We also know that if the IDS closes, Deaf Adult Literacy Services (DALS) will close along with the Irish Sign Language Academy (ISLA) and its advocacy service for deaf people trying to access State services. So, from this, I have been in contact with my sister (who is deaf and was once an instructor), on what we as a Students' Union could do to help our hard of hearing and deaf students.

In short, some of us wrote letters in solidarity with the IDS and also letters to TDs. The IDS are waiting to hear back from the government.
