Zhonna Gonzalez Davis (4BCL1): Very passionate about hybrid learning, UoG is not accessible for people with disabilities.

Laura Molly (2nd year) Meets lecturers every two weeks. Took a meeting as CEIM leader to discuss hybrid learning.

Abby – (2nd BA law): Would like to reform exams and push hybrid learning.

Mia – (4th Zoology): Wants to be part of conversation. Class rep for small class.

Transition back to campus still occurring & hybrid learning still happening.

Alexandrau Sortok (2nd Math): believes he can push hybrid learning

Scott Bushell – (4th Computing): Small class. Hybrid learning is a massive issue. Paid tutors currently paid 13€ despite the magnitude of issues they face.

Jakub Jaworski (2nd General Nursing): Wants to advocate for improving college especially nursing. Forced to work with no break, then sent back to college. Wants to improve accessibility. A class rep for 2 years and involved in many societies. Matthew Carty (2nd biotech): Hybrid learning is important. Registration means we can take any class, so we should be able to take them how we want to. Speakers reintroduce themselves.

19:31 Keeping Galway Moving

Presented by **Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer.**

Addresses Galway Ring Road. Claims Galway City Council believes we should be able to reach anywhere within 15 minutes.

Vevox on ideal transport mode (bus) & what is stopping you from using it? (weather, no gluas, no safe cycle lanes) & what are potential alternatives to the ring road? (gluas)

Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer outlines alternatives to ring roads & highlights detrimental nature of ring road to the environment. Argues ring road unnecessary. Welcomes alternatives to ring road.

- Chris MA Public Policy raises option of car share registration
 Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer concurs.
- Anon Speaker suggests more frequent + greater number of commuter trains.
 Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer says they are looking at increasing the frequency of trains and highlights commuter buses.
 - Zhonna Gonzalez Davis, Final BCL Law comments on City Direct bus service not showing up.
 - Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer concurs.
 - Anon Speaker requests access to letters Environmental Officer is sending to Galway City Council.

Environmental Awareness and Sustainability Officer agrees and requests comhairle informs her of issues and sends letters to Galway City Council.

19:50 Carparking

Leas-Uachtarán Don Ghaeilge discusses issues with parents parking on campus; Mature Taught Officer suggested *Parent Parking Permit*. Requests for students to email about parking to his email.

19:53 AOB & Suggestions

Majek Psych (BMS) notes dip in WiFi quality & requests why this happened &
 why main university WiFi has not returned.

Uachtarán has contacted ISS. EDUROAM crashed in lots of universities. Still working on it.

- Jakub Jaworski 2nd General Nursing. Temperature not regulated in lecture halls. Microwaves shut down when smokies closes. No kettles available. Hub kitchen closes early especially considering reading room closes late. Uachtarán: Regulated heating will be present in all lecture halls from now on. Microwave and hot water issue will be solved but may not come into effect until easter period.
- Tendai (4th Global Commerce): Hygiene issue raised. Cairnes Building taps have hot water but Arts Science Concourse has cold water.
 Uachtarán: Water stations being implemented on campus.
- Peter (Science and Engineering): Class representative for an online course.
 Most students take course online and therefore told exams will be online; now told online exams not possible. Students scared and don't know who to speak to.

VP for Education said to email him for further assistance.

- Michéal Cahill (3EV2): Outdoor seating especially during rain, no adequate facilities.
 - Uachtarán states meeting pods are being set up. WiFi enabled shelter being set up. Tents being set up (under new name?). Restricting cars from going under the concourse & supplying benches.
- VP for Gaeilge reminds Reps of town hall meeting being held on Wednesday in The Space on Wednesday to express small/big issues. Highlights Hallows event.
- Question raised as to whether there will be BBQ bacon burger there
 VP for Gaeilge: Maybe

- Question raised as to the purpose of the speak out tool: What is it? Does college get data?
 - VP for Welfare notes that the university does collect the data but that data may also be used to substantiate complaint.
- Akshay Kul... raised question as to access to vending machines in Cairnes since Friars closes at 3pm.

Uachtarán says yes as well as hopefully vending machines for condoms.
