- Seathrún (Jeffrey) Sardina [sé/é]
 - Situation where cost of living supports for postgraduates inaccessible
 - System is under poverty line.
 - Founder of PCA, tirelessly campaigned with TDs and set up protests

[Candidate repeats campaign as Gaeilge]

- Muhammad Sayyam Afzal
 - Honour to be here.
 - Highlights wage issues for postgraduates

Questions

Fionn Sexton-Connolly, **3rd BA Law w/ Arts** asks how candidates will set up unified front between PWO and the USI

Muhammad Sayyam Afzal is aware of this issue and has felt it himself. Claims USI is not doing enough to make people aware.

Seathrún (Jeffrey) Sardina has been involved with PWO on the national committee. As a USI officer he will be able to stay on that committee and link both.

Unknown speaker questions what candidates planned in terms of financial support in terms of SUSI and high fees

Seathrún (Jeffrey) Sardina [sé/é] notes that SUSI needs to be more accessible and is currently a broken system.

Muhammad Sayyam Afzal wants to be a representative for all, and that's Post-graduate taught students included. Notes that there is not enough representation and [...] is a place that is lacking overall. Notes his is a problem that can be solved.

Fionn Sexton Connolly, **3rd BA Law w/ Arts** states students do not know what USI does, what will candidates do about this?

Barry Ó Siochrú, **Leas-Uachtarán Don Ghaeilge** notes his vocality of dissatisfaction aboutt Gaeilge in USI. Claims lack of intersectionality in USI regarding roles. Questions how candidate would include Gaeilge in role.

Mary Tynan, MA Cleachtas Geairmiuíl sna Meáin/Irish Language Media questions whether candidates are open to campaigns on disability access

Kieron Portbury notes USI representative busy so not as successful as it could be. Would require clear outlines of policy in advance as opposed to right before. As much accessibility as required should be provided.

Christine was the DARE [Disability Access Route to Education] senator for DCU. Unions should be working with disability officers for students.

Zaid Albarghouthi offers structure for making campaigns. Will know what to campaign and what to ask for

Barry Ó Siochrú, **Leas-Uachtarán Don Ghaeilge** notes how USI structures Campaigns Strategy Committee which strategises for campaigns; criticises that the committee only met for the first time in November 2022. Notes that Campaigns Workgroup meets monthly.

Christine xyz, DCU has actively been a part of USI protests. When she was a first year 10,000 ppl attended, now you barely get 200 people. Wants to highlight ordinary student voices & not just officers.

Notes Campaigns Workgroup was meant to do occupation which didn't happen; disappointing since since entire point of occupation is to get attention and disrupt.

Zaid Albarghouthi outlines voting in terms of preference.

Kieron Portbury would teach people how to campaign and disseminate this information among SU officers.

Candidates for Vice-President for Equality and Citizenship

- Collete Murphy, DCU
 - Condemns cost of living + accommodation prices
 - Would increase lobbying
 - Would provide college survival guides
 - o Another National Mental Health Survey needed

- Last one done pre-covid, none done after.
- STI Competition
 - STI rates rising
 - Bring back Shag Packs

Imogen O'Flaherty Falconer, **Vice-President for Welfare And Equality** questions how to tackle drugs, alcohol & their misuse.

Colette Murphy, **DCU** notes this is a big issue with students which can be fun but can be harmful. Highlights Citizens Assembly working on decriminalisation; would disseminate info regarding addiction to students

Niamh McGrath, **Final Children Studies** questions how candidate will work with students on the ground regarding disability awareness across Ireland Colette Murphy, **DCU** states VP for Equality and Citizenship can't do much but notes not enough communication between DSS & Counselling

Candidates for Vice-President for Education

- Bryan XYZ, Waterford Vice-President for Education
 - Would implement Campaign Strategy & Constitutional Review
 Committee
 - Workshops for Education Officers to make sure they are supported and know how to talk to SUSI and education services.
 - Accessibility reform, exams are outdated draconian. Closed book exams too hard and don't apply to current working world.
 - SUSI reform, SUSI is inaccessible to students.

Joe Mee, **VP for Education** questions candidates main goal working with USI? Bryan XYZ, **Waterford VP for Education** states that assessment reform needs to be updated & reformed Mary Tynan, MA Cleachtas Geairmiuíl sna Meáin/Irish Language Media notes that a Masters course is 3 semesters long while SUSI only pays for 2. Questions whether this is an issue the candidates will address?

Sai Gujulla, University of Galway

- Sai Gujulla, University of Galway President
 - 18th Comhairle attended
 - As students mentioned, nobody knows what USI is therefore cannot engage with it
 - Would make USI more accessible to students

[Speaker reprimanded for incorrectly phrased question by Chairperson twice]
Speaker questions how candidates will use previous experience in the role
Sai Gujulla, CMLOG only involved by direct action; lockout for all students involved.
Hightlights National Working Group & Higher Education Institutions involved. Would get issues and suggestions from all student officers

Niamh McGrath, **Final Children Studies** questions how from previous experience on Unions do the candidates plan to involve all officers in campaigns on the ground *Sai Gujulla,* **CMLOG** plans to let them know they can attend National Council

Chris Newell, **General Manager CMLOG** outlines plans for Student pantry next year and for the Student's union to manage the pantry next year

Fionn Sexton-Connolly, **3rd BA Law w/ Arts** questions how businesses managed by the Student's Union Commercial Services do this year with the struggles of the cost of living issues

Speaker states businesses have been healthy but drop in footfall.

POI: *Barry Ó Siochrú*, **Leas-Uachtarán Don Ghaeilge** notes that CMLOG pays living wage in businesses

May McGrath notes the pantry is currently run by SocsBox and the Well Crew - will those students still be employed and will they be paid a living wage?

Speaker notes CMLOG will be doing recruiting process and will be in a position to pay in line with living wage based on finances. Notes CMLOG has no control over Well Crew.
