General Questions

Cost of Living

- Can SUSI be increased in line with inflation?
- What can be done to help students who struggle with accommodation & financial crises?
- What do you intend to change now for cost of living that will be better long term?
- What will you do to ensure rent reductions?
- Will you implement a permanent decrease in fees for third level students?

Global Affairs

These are questions regarding issues on a global level, and Ireland's important role we play in them



- Will your party enact the Occupied Territories
 Bill?
- What support will you be offering migrants entering the country, in particular refugees?
- How will you further environmental action to combat the environmental crisis?
- What will you do about the rise of fascism and the far right?
- How will you support students from Palestine, and ending the genocide in Gaza?
- How will you stop the increasing numbers of students emigrating?

Housing and **Transport**

These are questions regarding the rental crisis, and public transport for students

- What measures are being taken to effectively address the housing crisis, in particular for **International Students?**
- What are you going to do about affordable student accommodation?
- Do you intend to build more accommodation?
- How will you empower young buyers entering the housing market?
- What is your party's view on fuel tax being imposed on people who live rurally with no public transport options?
- Will developments be made to improve Ireland's public transport so we are on par with our **European counterparts?**
