 - Loughnane Yes 20% higher bracket, focused on finance, sorry about lack of third world countries in the university
- *Unknown* Flexible learnings opportunities, not for internationals
 - Loughnane predominantly domestic
- Fionn Sexton-Connolly, Postgraduate Taught Officer passing rates, 12% high, CÉIM good, postgrads need a buddy system
 - Loughnane PGT buddy system wouldn't work because its only a year
- Chris Stewart, Postgraduate Research Officer emphasize any student living in poverty cannot reach, researchers metrics not recommended, biased don't match actual activities
 - Loughnane agrees, bibliometics anti humanities
- Fiona O'Brien, 2nd Year BA Human Rights fees are huge, will there be change with how information goes (repeats in June)
 - Loughnane fair point, trying to improve situation
- Sage, **School of Botany** housing before students move in, no vets (scams), international students fault, grad students are not prepared for later interviews (GTA)
 - Loughnane look into housing situation, trying to balance
- Mary Tynan, Disability Rights Officer underrepresentation in physically disabled,
 PHD in Irish no one with Akadva
 - Loughnane Concerted efforts, supports haven't followed
